Day 1

Transferred to Hotel in Nuwaraeliya

City Tour in Nuwaraeliya city.

Blessed with a salubrious climate, breathtaking views of valleys, meadows, mountains and greenery; it's hard to imagine that Nuwara Eliya is only 180 Km from the hot and humid Colombo.

Nuwara Eliya (City of Lights), also known as 'Little' England', was the favorite hill station of the British who tried to create Nuwara Eliya into a typical English Village. The old brick Post office, country house like hill club, with its hunting pictures, mounted hunting trophies and fish, and it's strict formal dinner attire; the 18 hole golf course, race course etc., all remind you of 'England'.

Day 2

Breakfast at hotel and visit Hakgala Botanical Gardens

Hakgala Botanical Gardens - The Gardens was first established in 1861 under the curatorship of three British of the same name - William Nock, JK Nock and JJ Nock. It lies under the Hakgala Peak, between 5000 - 6000 feet in elevation - the highest set Botanic Gardens in the world. It boasts 100 year old Monetary Cypress trees from California, Japanese Cedars, Himalayan Pines and English Oak.

After lunch Tour to a Tea Factory

Labookellie is one of the 700 tea factories in Sri Lanka and are producers of the best tea on this island. It's a multi-store building and is just abt. 10 km from Nuwara Eliya in the Ramboda sub-district.



Sri Lanka is the world's biggest tea exporter, so it is a must to visit one tea factory, otherwise you cannot say you have been in Sri Lanka.

2. Detail of just fresh plucked tealeaf. Only the young tealeaves are plucked for the production of tea.
3. In the tea factory Labookellie you can have a guided tour.
4. The green, fresh plucked tealeaves are spread out on the nylon nets and stay there for abt. 18 hours. This is called withering.
5. Shortly the process of tea manufacturing:
 - plucking
 - withering
 - rolling
 - fermentation
 - drying
 - sorting
6. In front of the tea house.
7. When you come to the Labookellie tea factory you will be invited to their tea room where they serve (of course) delicious tea with some cake. After that you can buy in their shop behind the tea room some of their nicely packed tea.



Day 3

Breakfast at Hotel and leave to Colombo En route visit to Ambewela Milk Factory

Ambewela Milk Factory - Ambewela is a small town, or a hill station, located in the Nuwara Eliya District of Sri Lanka. The area is also sometimes called Little New Zealand. The town is situated approximately 17 km south-east of the district capital Nuwara Eliya. Ambewela is also popular for being the highest (in altitude) and widest grassland in Sri Lanka. If you visit Ambewela you can see borderless Grass lands spreads all over the area. The climatic and economical conditions in Ambewela make it an ideal location for dairy farming, hence the country's only milk powder factory is situated in this area. The two animal husbandries, Ambewela Farm and New Zealand Farm, have Ayrshire cattle and Friesian cows respectively.
